



Nurture, Play, Learn - Prep

Overview

Cedar is a self-declared Nature Reporter. He has a special Nature Reporter Notebook that he takes on adventures in his backyard to record all of the exciting things that he sees. Cedar has discovered that before he leaves the house he needs to be prepared. Hence, the Nature Reporters checklist...

Nature reporters ...

Feel the presence of nature,
Look for the hidden and small,
Hear what is hardly there and
Smell the coming rain.

They use all of their senses to understand the places around them.

Nurture, Play, Learn, involves the students in Cedar's story. Cedar's Nature Reporter Notebook has been found by one of our staff, incomplete. Prior to the excursion, the students are enlisted as Nature Reporters. It is their job to come to Currumbin with their 5 senses tuned in, and then piece together Cedar's notebook.

The Prep Nature Reporters will investigate the needs of living things while working with our gardens and animals. They will also play in our Natureplay area and learn through experiencing our open-ended play opportunities. The clues (living and non-living) that they find will be used to complete Cedars notebook when they return to school.

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Program Overview - A Day in the Life of a Nature Reporter

"I wonder" what information we need to discover today?

The students will meet the staff at CVC and look through the journal to find out their purpose for their excursion. They will prepare to be Nature Reporters by tuning in their senses.

"I wonder" what living things need?

The students will spend this session investigating the *needs of living things*. They will find many answers to the missing sections in Cedars journal by completing some chicken chores, feeding the ducks and working in the productive gardens.

"I wonder" how we play in nature?

The students will spend this session looking for clues while playing in nature. The students will have access to our climbing tree, revegetation area, loose parts play and the creek bed. Teachers and parents are invited to participate in this session by observing how the students are playing. As the students immerse themselves in their play they will find some of the answers that they are looking for.
